WA Plastics Free Programme

To support the implementation of Western Australia's Plan for Plastics, the WA State Government has partnered with Boomerang Alliance, to deliver a programme called WA Plastics Free Programme. Boomerang Alliance was formed in 2003 and are a peak community not-for-profit organisation working on waste minimisation and recycling in Australia.

Plastic Free Places is a hands-on behaviour change programme that works directly with food retailers, events, markets and other organisations, to assist them to switch from single-use plastics to better alternatives, such as reusable (preferred) or certified compostable items. On July 1st, 2022, a state- wide ban was enforced on certain single use plastic items, as part of a national effort to combat plastic pollution.

Boomerang Alliance work in communities across Australia and the combined impact of all of their programmes as of February 1, 2022, has enabled the elimination of over 14,000,000 pieces of plastic.

They target the six most littered food & beverage packaging items.

- **1** Plastic water bottles
- 2 Any thickness plastic bags
- 3 Plastic coffee cups & lids
- 4 Plastic straws
- **5** Plastic takeaway containers
- 6 Plastic cutlery & other food ware (including plastic cups, plates etc.)

September's Adult Wardrobe Refresh

Once again, the Shire combined with WMRC (West Metropolitan Regional Council) held another Wardrobe Refresh in the fight against landfill, it was another resounding success.



The volume of people who attended far exceeded The next one is for children's clothing and the previous Wardrobe Refresh; we had more than 150 people walking through the doors. There was a steady stream of people coming in with bags and arms full of clothing, shoes, hats, active wear, and various accessories to donate. People were leaving with pieces they had found for themselves and family members.

This year we weighed all the clothes being donated which totalled 374.62kg and then weighed the remaining balance after the event had closed. As a result, we found there was an 89.43% diversion rate from landfill, which is a commendable figure.

The Wardrobe Refreshes are such an enormous hit we plan to run four per year.

Short-Stay Accommodation

Short-stay accommodation and Bed & Breakfast accommodation often listed on platforms such as Airbnb and Stayz is controlled through the Shire's Local Planning Scheme and requires development approval.

Landowners are reminded that development approval will need to be in place and any pool barrier must be compliant to be covered by their insurance policies.

The Shire will require an applicant to demonstrate there is sufficient on-site parking and suitable management practices in place to ensure the local amenity is protected. Comment from immediately abutting neighbours and your body corporate for strata developments will also be sought. Development Services can assist further should you be contemplating these uses, or be concerned about premises offering short-stay accommodation.

Community Recycling **Stations**

Until recently, the Shire had a Community Recycling Station in the foyer which received old household batteries, light globes, ink cartridges and toners.

The station was provided by the West Metropolitan Regional Council (WMRC) and it was emptied by them on a regular basis. The station has been removed by WMRC, mainly due to a change in the recycling of household batteries. The Federal Government has introduced a stewardship programme (B-cycle) which means the retainer that sells batteries has an obligation to take them back for recycling.

Even though the recycling station has gone from the Council foyer, there are other recycling options nearby. Woolworths in Cottesloe Central will take batteries and mobile phones, Cottesloe Post Office will take ink cartridges and toners.
