

## Message from the Shire President (cont.)

The roll out of the Green Organics (GO bins) for the disposal of green waste has been very successful with waste diverted from landfill and turned into mulch.

The introduction of the GO bins has resulted in a reduction in our waste disposal costs and enabled the Shire to reduce the cost of second bins.

This month we are introducing a Verge Valet system for bulk waste collections.

Please read the 'Verge Valet – Peppermint Grove' brochure delivered with this edition of PepTalk which explains how the process will work. This new system will still provide three general

waste and three green waste verge collections each year, however, you will be able book the verge collection at a time that suits you.

At the end of last year, the Shire commenced a review of the Community Strategic Plan with questionnaires on resident priorities sent to all households. Thank you to everyone who provided comments and ideas. The responses are now being collated and Council will be considering all your feedback as we finalise the review of our Strategic Plan for the next five years.

This year it was a change of location requiring a larger space to meet social distancing requirements. It was located at Bayview Park in Mosman Park with astonishing views overlooking the Swan River and beyond.

The event was attended by dignitaries including Dr David Honey MLA, Celia Hammond MP and Patti Chong (Australia Day Ambassador), as well as the Shire President and Mayor's of Mosman Park and Cottesloe.

On Australia Day, local governments take the opportunity to acknowledge community contribution and to celebrate community engagement of people and groups within the

Over 350 people joined our Citizens of the Year for a free community sausage sizzle cooked by Mosman Park Rotary Club and served by Mosman Park Youth Advisory Council.

A flag raising ceremony was conducted with the Australian Flag being raised by Sea Scout James Stout. Entertainment was provided by the Mighty Camelot Choir, who also led the national anthem while children's entertainer Glenn Swift entertained the younger children with stories and games.

### Leaf Blowers and Grass Cuttings

Every now and then Shire staff find lawn mowing contractors taking the option of blowing lawn clippings and leaves onto the road rather than cleaning them up for disposal. Not only does this leave a mess behind, eventually the debris finds its way into the drainage system increasing drain cleaning costs for ratepayers. To avoid these issues, please ensure your mowing contractor or gardener uses the GO green bin provided for greenwaste.

### Dinghy Bays

We have a limited number of dinghy bays now available for hire at the river foreshore for \$200 per annum (registrations expire 31st December each year). Please contact Penny at the Shire 9286 8600 for more information about these.

### Waste Passes

Your waste passes will be mailed out to you in the same envelope as your July rates for the second year running. 2 bulk waste and 2 green waste passes are at the bottom of an A4 page which clearly states in red **do not throw this away**. for the younger cub members and is part of the team organising WA's participation in the Scout Jamboree in Victoria in 2022.

The Award for Community Group of the Year was presented to SHINE Community Services for the many services their staff and volunteers provide to the elderly and the vulnerable, not only in the Shire, but also in our neighbouring districts.

## Manners Hill Park - Capital Works Program

As part of the Shire's Capital Works Program the Manners Hill Park area will be receiving a spruce up.

The old paving in the Pavilion will be pulled up and replaced, plus a new pathway constructed around the toilet block linking the two facilities and improving accessibility. To provide an indication of the what is planned, sample pavers are now available for public viewing in the Pavilion.

The exterior of the Depot building will get a new coat of paint to freshen it up, as will the public toilets. To improve public safety and address Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) compliance requirements, a 1.2m open view fence will be erected around the Depot forecourt area along with a sliding access gate. This gate will be closed during Depot working hours for safety reasons but left open to the public after work and on the weekends.

Another project scheduled for FY20/21 is renewal of the in-ground reticulation system. The current pipework dates back to the early 1980's and needs an upgrade. The new reticulation infrastructure will use the latest smart technology to provide better coverage, reduced water use and increase the system's overall reliability.

## Pet Talk – Registrations

All cats and dogs living in Peppermint Grove must be registered with the Council, it is a legal requirement.

The Dog Act allows varying periods for registration (1 year, 3 years and a lifetime). Owners; if your personal information has changed, please contact the Shire as it is your responsibility to keep the registration and contact details up to date. It is also important you can be contacted in an emergency involving your beloved companion.


